

ESQUIMALT GORGE PARK RESTORATION PROJECT

GREEN SHORES® FOR SHORELINE DEVELOPMENT DEMONSTRATION SITE PROJECT UPDATES FALL 2025


Located in the Township of Esquimalt, the project site is on the south shoreline of the Gorge Waterway, near the parking lot at Sioux Place. It is within the traditional territory of the Lekwungen (Ləkwəŋən) People, known today as the Songhees Nation and Xwsepsum Nation. The site is also located within the <u>Victoria Harbour Migratory Bird Sanctuary</u> and is important to numerous species such as Buffleheads that use and migrate through this area.




KEY FEATURES OF RESTORED SITE

An extensive riparian zone was planted with native species while retaining overhanging vegetation. The shoreline was restored using natural materials such as large woody debris, repurposed boulders from riprap removal, and native plants. The grade was also adjusted to create a more gradual slope, improving resilience to sea level rise and storms.







Educational signage was installed and accessibility to the shoreline for park users was improved with a newly installed mobi-mat. Split rail fencing protects the native plants and trees in the important riparian zone.







PARTNERSHIPS

Partnerships have been key for this collaborative project and have included the the Pacific Salmon Foundation, Stewardship Centre for British Columbia, Township of Esquimalt, Capital Regional District, Gorge Waterway Action Society, and World Fisheries Trust.
